BYLAW 1-2018

A BYLAW OF THE PONASS LAKE WASTE MANAGEMENT SITE AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR THE OPERATION OF THE TRANSFER STATION.

The Board of the Ponass Lake Waste Management Site Authority in the Province of Saskatchewan, in open meeting hereby enacts as follows:

Short title

1. This bylaw may be cited as the Ponass Lake Waste Management Site Transfer Station Bylaw No. 1-2018.

Definitions

- 2. In this bylaw the following definitions shall apply:
 - a. "approved container" means a container that meets the requirements of this Bylaw and of the Board and that has been approved for use in the Transfer Station by the Board;
 - b. "construction wast=" means unwanted material produced directly or incidentally by the construction industries. This includes building materials such as shingles, lumber, insulation, nails, electrical wiring, and rebar;
 - "Board" means the board of the Ponass Lake Waste Management Site Authority;
 - d. "household waste" means waste originating from domestic activities at a residence, and includes:
 - i. putrescible organic waste produced as a by-product of the handling, preparation, cooking, consumption or storage of food;
 - ii. non-putrescible materials, including packaging material, clothing, containers, paper products, small appliances, household items, diapers;
 - iii. non-hazardous remains, by products, or discarded materials; and
 - iv. yard waste including grass clippings, leaves, branches, trees, garden matter, soil, sod or dirt;
 - e. "liquid waste containing grit" means liquid waste that contains solid matter, including ashes, cinders, sanc, stone or any other solid or viscous substance that may impair the operations of the sanitary sewer system;
 - f. "prohibited waste" means waste listed in Schedule "B" to this Bylaw;
 - g. "putrescible" means waste that is capable of decomposing with sufficient rapidity so as to cause a nuisance from odours or gases, or that is likely to attract birds, insects, snakes, rodents or other animals, or that may otherwise be a health risk;
 - h. "residence" means a dwelling of any type;
 - . "resident" means an individual residing within the boundaries of the Town of Rose Valley, the Village of Archerwill, the Village of Fosston or the Rural Municipality of Ponass Lake No. 367;
 - "transfer station" means the operations of the Ponass Lake Waste Management Site Transfer Station Grounds;
 - k. "transfer station grounds" means the Ponass Lake Waste Management Site Authority's waste disposal site located on NW 03-39-13 W2nd;
 - I. "transfer station attendant" means a person contracted by resolution of the Board of the Ponass Lake Waste Management Site Authority as Transfer Station Attendant, whose duties are to supervise the activity within the Transfer Station Grounds; and

- M2¹¹ (a) Members of the transfer station shall be residents of:
 - a. The Town of Rose Valley;
 - b. The Village of Archerwill;
 - c. The Village of Fosston; and
 - d. The Rural Municipality of Ponass Lake No. 367.
- 3. No person shall deposit prohibited waste on transfer station grounds as defined in Schedule "B" to this Bylaw.
- 4. Scavenging is strictly prohibited on transfer station grounds at all times.
- 5. The Transfer Station Attendant shall inspect all waste brought to the transfer station to determine if the load contains allowable waste, prohibited waste or recyclable material.
- 6. Loads containing prohibitec waste will be refused.

Comply with Directions

- 7. Every person who attends the transfer station shall:
 - a. report to the shed;
 - b. comply with all instruction, directions and signs; and
 - e. pay the applicable fee for disposal at the transfer station shed as provided in Schedule "A" to the Bylaw.
- 8. Any person with an unpaid account with the transfer station may be refused access to the transfer station until the outstanding account has been paid.

Unsafe Behaviour

9. Persons using abusive or threatening language or gestures, or otherwise behaving in an unsafe manner may be refused access to the Transfer Station at the discretion of the Transfer Station Attendant and/or the Board and/or Administrators.

Hours of Operation

- 10. The hours of operation of the Transfer Station shall be:
 - a. set by the Board; and
 - b. posted at the Transfer Station.
- 11. No person shall deliver waste to the Transfer Station except during the hours of operation.

Disposition of Waste

- 12. All waste deposited at the Transfer Station becomes the property of the Ponass Lake Waste Management Site.
- 13. No person shall remove any waste or recyclable material from the Transfer Station.

Enforcement

- 14. The administration and enforcement of this Bylaw is delegated to the Board.
- 15. The Board is authorized to further delegate the administration and enforcement of this Bylaw to municipal inspectors.

Offences and Penalties

16. Every person commits an offence who:

MP enalty

- 18. Any person who contravenes a provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fire:
 - a. For the first offence, of \$100.00;
 - b. For a second offence, of \$200.00; and
 - c. For a third or subsequent offence, of not less than \$200.00 and not more than \$10,000.00 in the case of an individual or \$25,000.00 in the case of a corporation.

Coming into Force

19. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the day of its final passing.
