

Hamlet of St. Front

St. Front is a quiet hamlet in east-central Saskatchewan with strong French and Belgian heritage. Founded in **1910** and named after *Saint Frontus*, a second-century Christian martyr, the community is known for its agricultural roots and proud curling tradition.

Location & Municipal Boundaries

Situated along **Highway 630**, St. Front is split between two rural municipalities:

- The **west side** falls under the **Rural Municipality of Spalding No. 368**
- The **east side** is part of the **Rural Municipality of Ponass Lake No. 367**

Curling Legacy

Curling has been a cornerstone of the community since the early 1960s. A newly built facility in **2020** renewed local interest and provided modern space for both play and events.

Historical Notes

Settlers arrived in the early 20th century seeking farmland and opportunity. A chapel, constructed in **1913**, became a gathering place for worship and community events.

Community Lifestyle

St. Front remains a peaceful, close-knit farming community surrounded by prairie landscape. It's located between **Naicam** and **Rose Valley**, and about **40 km north of Quill Lake**, making it a quiet but connected part of the region.
