Historical Overview

- The **Fosston Post Office** was established in **1908**, serving early settlers in the region
- The village was officially **incorporated on January 1, 1965**
- Named after **Fosston, Minnesota**, the original home of five homesteading brothers who settled in the area

Fosston once featured a general store, hardware shop, cafe, school, blacksmith, and grain elevators—serving as a vital hub for surrounding farms. Though quieter today, the village remains a proud symbol of Saskatchewan's rural heritage.
