#### BYLAW NO 2/17

# A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES WITH A GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT GREATER THAN 20 TONNES ON ROADWAYS WITHIN THE RURAL **MUNICIPALITY OF PONASS LAKE NO. 367**

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Ponass Lake No. 367 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

#### Short Title

This Bylaw may be referred to as the Reduced Speed Bylaw

### PART I – PURPOSE AND DEFINITIONS

#### Purpose

The purpose of this bylaw is:

- 1) to reduce the speed of vehicles with a gross vehicle weight greater than 20 tonnes, using municipal highways or any particular municipal highway in the municipality, and
- 2) to set penalties and/or fines for those persons who exceed the speed limit set out in this bylaw.

#### Definitions

In this bylaw:

- "Administrator" means the administrator of the municipality;
- 2) "Minister" means the member of the Executive Council to whom for the time being the administration of The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997, is assigned;
- "Municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Ponass Lake No. 367;
- "Council" means the council for the Rural Municipality of Ponass Lake No. 367;
- "Roadway" means any public roadway within the Rural Municipality under the direction, control and management of the Municipality and "public highway" means a public highway as defined by The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997; and
- "Motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle as defined by or pursuant to The Traffic Safety Act.

# PART II – PROVISIONS

- 1) No person shall operator a motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight greater than 20 tonnes at a speed greater than 60 kilometers per hour on any roadway
- Signs indicating the maximum speed allowed shall be erected on all roadways entering the municipality
- No person shall deface, injure, destroy or remove any speed limit sign or marker erected in accordance with the provisions of this Bylaw.

# PART III – ENFORCEMENT

# Penalty

A person who contravenes any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a penalty as identified in the Highway and Transportation Act, 1997.
