

BYLAW 07/2016

BEING A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Wawken No. 93 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows

1. In this Bylaw:
 - a) "municipal road" means a public highway or municipally owned roadway that is under the direction, management and control of the municipality,
 - b) "roadway" means that part of a public highway designed or intended for the use by vehicles but does not include a trail designated under *The Snowmobile Act* or any other trail or path for which a permit is required.
2. No person shall operate a motor vehicle at a greater speed than 60 kilometers per hour on the portion of a municipal road described as follows:

One half mile section of municipal grid #711 along the south end of Section 29, Township 11, Range 3 West of the Second Meridian between regulatory signs placed 1056 feet from the East corner of the Section going Westward and 1584 feet from the West corner of the Section going Eastward.
3. No person shall operate a motor vehicle at a greater speed than 30 kilometers per hour on the portion of a municipal road described as follows:

One half mile section of municipal grid along the south end of Southwest Section 6, Township 11, Range 2 West of the Second Meridian ending at the south end of Southeast Section 6, Township 11, Range 2 West of the Second Meridian between the regulatory signs placed at the west corner of the intersection of Highway 9 and the south corner of Southwest Section 6, Township 11, Range 2 West of the Second Meridian and at the south end of Southeast Section 6, Township 11, Range 2 West of the Second Meridian.
4. Signs indicating the maximum speed allowed shall be erected along the municipal road at the commencement of the speed zone area and signs shall be erected showing the end of the speed zone area.
5. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this bylaw is guilty of an offence under *The Traffic Safety Act*, *The Snowmobile Act* and *The School Bus Operating Regulations* and liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided by *The Summary Offences Procedure Act* and/or any other applicable legislation.
